dede: 673-735

- scientific, historical and theological works
- Familiar with latin, greek and probably hebrew
- historial wal zoffard: bede "holds a privileged and unrivaled place among first historians of christian europe."



dede: 673-735

- best-known for 'ecclesiastical history of the english people'
- established custom of a.d. dating
- 'doctor of the church' 1899
- declared a saint 1935
